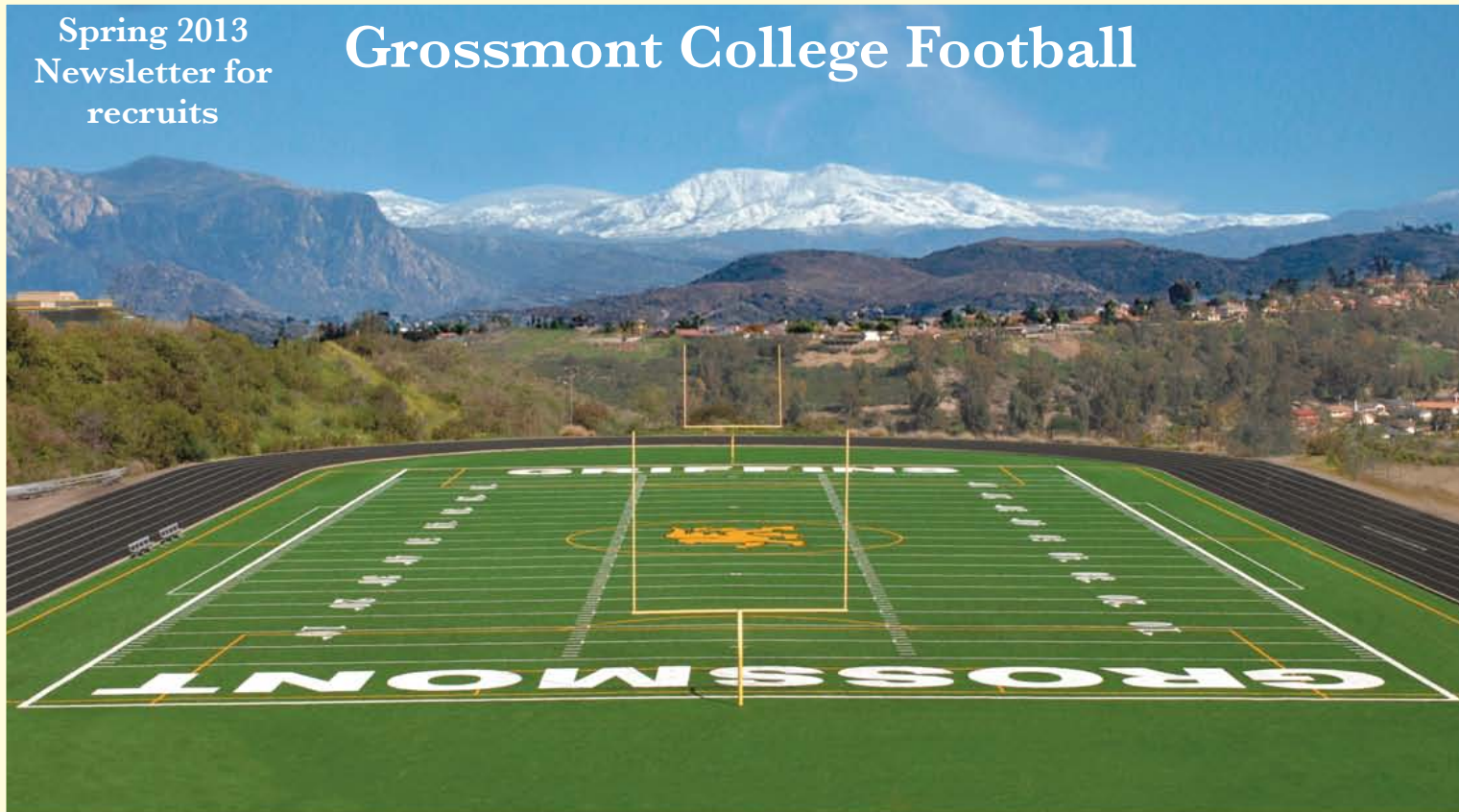

Grossmont College Football has been a power in the state for most of the past 15 Years with only one losing season at (4-6). Since the re conferencing of Southern California Community College Football, the Griffins have remained in one of the top conferences in the State. This level of competition both attracts **University Coaches** and prepares you to compete at the highest level. We have had **numerous players** move on to Universities from Grossmont College the last two decades. The number of scholarships would be tough for any community college to match.

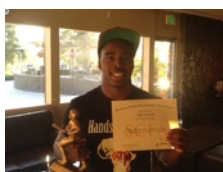

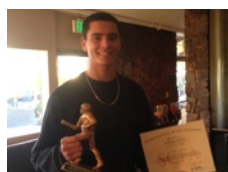

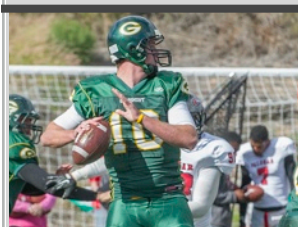

G-HOUSE HISTORY

From 2000-2006 the Griffin Football Program accomplished unprecedented numbers including a 75-10 overall record a 58-2 conference record, losing only 1 home game (in triple overtime), playing in 15 post season contests, and the state championship game twice. During this stint the Griffins had the top 10 ranked offense 6 of 7 years, the number 1 offense in 2005, and the number one defense in 2006.

Looking Back at Great Seasons

The Grossmont College Football program has accomplished many great feats over the past few decades, but 1998, 2003, and 2005 were three of the very best.

2005 State and National Champs

The Griffins finish the 2005 season with a 13-1 record and a State and National Championship. The Griffins rolled through the So Cal Playoffs beating Glendale, Canyons and El Camino. They capped off the season with a 41-38 victory over San Francisco City College in Fresno CA.



2003 Southern California Champs

In 2003 Grossmont beat Canyons and then powerhouse Fullerton to put them in the State Championship Game against San Francisco City College. This game was an epic battle with SF City driving 95 yards and scoring a 30 yard TD pass with no time remaining.



1998 Potato Bowl

Before the Playoff system was installed in 2003, The Potato Bowl was the biggest Community College Bowl game in the nation. The Griffis beat Bakersfield 23-17 in front of the Renegades 10,000 screaming fans.

SCFA DIVISION CONFERENCE ALIGNMENT

2012 & 2013

The SCFA has restructured conference alignment for the third time in six seasons as they strive for competitive balance. The powerful “National Division” teams will compete at the highest level each week as they match up against one another. There are seven bowl games as well as the Southern California playoffs for National Division teams. The lower level “American Division” teams will play for a single bowl game amongst the 16 teams and are not playoff eligible. Grossmont College has remained in the top “National Division” since the first realignment in 2006.

In 2012 or 2013 Neither the American Mountain nor the American Pacific are allowed to qualify for the State playoffs or a bowl game against the stronger National Division Teams. They will have a separate ranking system in 2013.

What We Are Most Proud Of

- * Over the last decade Grossmont College football has produced more scholarships for their athletes than any of the other San Diego Community Colleges.
- * 20 players in the last 2 decades inducted into the National Football Foundation Hall of Fame as San Diego's best Scholar athletes. Thats more than the other SD Community Colleges.
- * GC has had more Community College All Americans as well as academic All Americans than the other local schools.
- * GC has dozens of former football players now teaching and coaching at every level.
- * Grossmont College football has had 21 post season bowl games and playoffs. That ranks at the top of the football programs in the state.

When the historic 4-game playoffs were initiated from 2003-08, Grossmont had taken part in 4 of 5 years

In 2003 the state decided to go away from a 2-game playoff system based on voting to a 4-game system where the true champion would be determined. Grossmont has participated in all 4, was state runner up to San Francisco in 2003, and state champion in 2005.

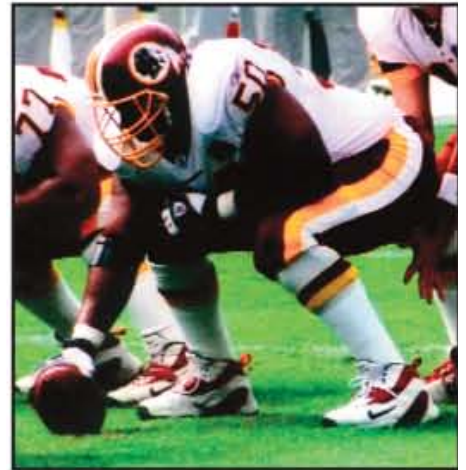

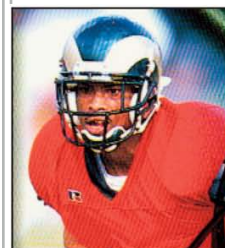

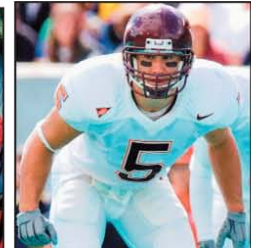

Brian transferred to SDSU after 1 year at GC. He starred for SDSU, then Cleveland for 10 years an All Pro.



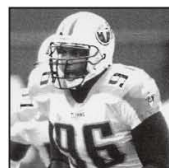

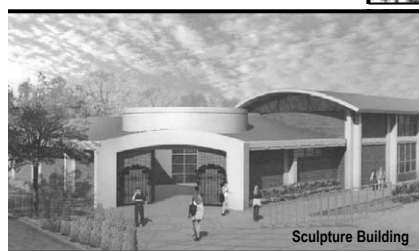

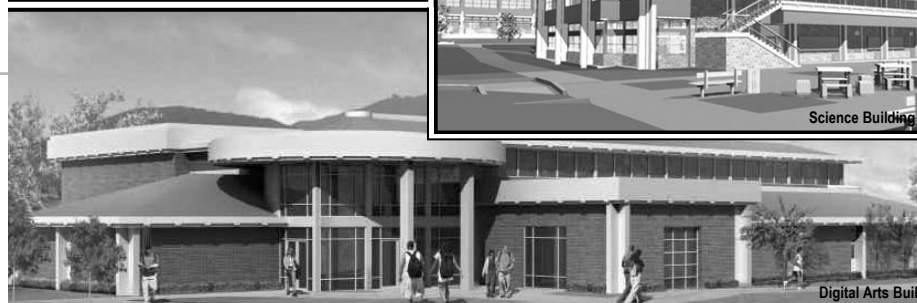
