

ANTICIPATED ECONOMIC INCREASE FOR 2011!

Despite a pickup in hiring and growing stability in the housing market, it will take San Diego County at least another four years to struggle back to pre-recessionary levels, according to a panel of economists and business leaders at the annual San Diego County Economic Roundtable.



Compared to the past seven years, the outlook for 2011 is relatively bright, with accelerating job growth, a stabilizing housing market and a growing Tech Sector. The panelists agreed that job growth locally, (netgain, 10,000 to 15,000 jobs) would surpass the amount of jobs for 2010 at 6,300.

Predictions revealed that the local unemployment rate - now at 10.3% - could dip to 9 percent range by the end of this year. However, by pre-recession standards, late 1990's, 40,000 jobs were available to job seekers each year. Job growth will remain painfully slow in 2011.

2011: THE YEAR OF EMPLOYMENT GROWTH NATIONAL/GLOBAL

In the United States, 33 states can "anticipate considerable increases" in hiring, while all 50 states report positive hiring intentions. Prospects for U.S. job growth, has improved modestly going into the second quarter of 2011.

Around the Globe, 33 of 39 countries and territories can anticipate considerable increases; the strongest hiring will occur in India, Taiwan, China, Turkey, Brazil, and Singapore. In Mexico, the Net Employment Outlook improved to a 14% gain compared to 10% a year ago. In Canada, the outlook improved to an 11% gain compared to 8% a year ago.
