

San Diego's unemployment rate was 10.1% in December, 2009; the U.S. unemployment rate was unchanged at 10.0%; while the State of California's unemployment rate was unchanged at 12.4% in December 2009.

ECONOMIC RECOVERY - SLOW

Local experts at the 2010 annual San Diego Economic Roundtable, hosted by the University of San Diego on January 7th, discussed their outlooks of the local economy and the general consensus was that the prolonged recession is over and we are entering into an economic recovery period both locally and nationally that will be slow. Job creation is expected to be relatively slow but as two tough years of downsizing begin to fade in the rearview mirror, jobseekers can look forward to an economy on the rise, and a lagging but slowly improving job market towards the end of the year.
