

What is Biotechnology?

The use of living organisms or their products in industry or technology.

Biotechnology companies create medicines that help patients with AIDS, strokes, heart disease, cancer, diabetes and other diseases. They also make diagnostic tests used for pregnancy, AIDS, cancer and other conditions. Techniques of biotechnology are used in agriculture, industrial applications, forensics, mining, environmental cleanup and other industries. Other biotechnology companies specialize in bioinformatics which uses computer technology to organize, share and analyze complex biological information.

Why San Diego?

San Diego is home to 502 biomedical companies. The region's climate of innovation is prevalent and San Diego is also home to the highest number of science based Nobel Prize winners in the world. The biotech sector directly employed 32,409 people in 2003. As a life science industry, it captured \$927 million in venture capital investments in 2002 and 2003.

Who Does A Biotechnology Company Employ?

Biotechnology is very diverse and includes diagnostics, therapeutics, agriculture, environment, tissue, devices and tools. Employers in this industry are looking for applicants who have a life science background, are flexible, well trained, can learn new technologies and multi-task. Successful individuals in this field will be lifelong learners, critical thinkers, have good lab skills and attention to detail. Proficiency in reading, writing and arithmetic (algebra), and good oral communication skills are also recommended.

February Job Growth

On the national scene, employers added 262,000 new jobs in February 2005. This is the most jobs added in the past four months. While the labor market continues to improve, analysts note that it hasn't reached full recovery. Time Off Grows in Importance for Americans

Americans are increasingly opting for time off rather than a larger paycheck. According to a Salary.com's on-line survey conducted in November 2004, "39% of workers said if given the choice, they would choose time off over the equivalent in additional base salary." While the majority of the survey respondents (4,600) still opted for a larger paycheck, this survey showed a 20% increase in respondents preferring time off rather than increased pay in comparison to similar survey conducted by Salary.com three years ago.
