Charles F. Vittor, a new English instructor, is the first GC graduate to return to teach at his alma mater. Vittor was in the first graduating class of GC at the Monte Vista campus.

While attending GC, Vittor maintained a 4.0 average nearly every semester. He was a member of Alpha Gamma Sigma, campus scholarship club.

Vittor says that GC students have changed very little, if any, from the time when he was a student. Vittor, who continued his higher education at San Diego State, earning an AB and MA degree, said he was impressed by the former GC students he met there.

Vittor says that the one per-son who influenced him the most in his choice of a teaching career was Mrs. Shirley Acheson, now an instructor who was a counselor while he was at GC.
