
Reveles' first public reading to be at Grossmont

English Instructor Joe Medina, along with the Puente Project, the English Department and the Associated Student Body will be presenting a public reading by author Daniel Reveles on Thursday, April 27. The purpose of Reveles' visit, according to Medina, is to expose the students of Grossmont College to what Medina refers to as "a true "Renaissance man."

Originally, the Reveles readings were assigned by Medina as an optional reading in an English 110 class. But, through the inquires of students Andres Alvarez and Abraham Ramos, the author granted an interview, which ended with an invitation to speak at Grossmont. This will be Reveles' first ever public reading of his work. "When I asked him, he said that it would be his honor. [Reveles] told me that he didn't know what to say, and I gave him a few pointers,"commented Medina.

Along with the collection of short shorties that Reveles will be presenting is "Enchiladas, Rice and Beans." Before the reading, there will be a food sale, with hot plates of enchiladas, rice and beans available for \$3 per plate, followed by live entertainment from members of the Grossmont Music Department. Reveles' books are currently available in the bookstore, and Reveles will be signing books after the presentation. Both admission and parking will be free. Food will be available at 5:30 p.m., and Reveles will begin his presentation around 7:30 p.m., with a question and answer period following.
