"U" Grad Tells Of Trip Abroad

VERMILLION, Nov. 14 — Just returned from Norway where she studied at the University of Oslo last summer, Miss Barbara Wangsness of Garretson, says that rationing is stricter in Norway than in any other country she visited, including England and its widely-advertised "austerity program."

Miss Wangsness, who graduated from the University of South Dakota in 1947 where she was elected "Miss Dakota," took post-graduate courses in Norway in literature, music, history and Norweg: ian; culture. This latter course enabled her to meet many Norwegian notables, she reports.

Countries visited by Miss Wangsness and her companion, Marie Bjorkman, a Northwestern University graduate, included, Norway, Denmark, France, Switzerland, Holland, Germany, England and Scotland. In Scotland, they attended the International Festival of Music and Drama at Edinburgh.

Miss Wangsness was impressed with the friendliness and helpfulness of people generally in every country she visited. She left New York, June 20, 1948, and arrived back there, October 29.
