Classified Behind The Scenes...

When I first came to Grossmont College in 2010, I walked through the walkway of the old building 10 and as it opened up onto the quad, I was struck at the beauty of our campus. I knew this was a place I wanted to work. To this day, I walk around campus and I am amazed by the different landscapes we have, and it never gets old.

Did you know Grossmont College is 135 acres with 6 drought tolerant outdoor learning gardens and one nature trail for outdoor biology learning? Did you know that we have a grounds crew of 4 to make and maintain our beautiful grounds? Jack Newman, Marty Hipwell, Jim Gillan and Kelly White are the team of classified staff who work to pull off this amazing feat. Jack Newman is the grounds crew lead. He has been at Grossmont for 22 years and has worked in the landscape business for 37 years. When asked what did he enjoy about his job? He replied, "I totally enjoy the responsibility of maintaining the diverse landscape of the campus".

A maintenance crew of five takes care of the 100 buildings on campus. They are responsible for 875,000 square feet, 100 bathrooms, 1000 offices and 275 classrooms. This team includes Chris Weiss - Locksmith, Josh Ketchum - maintenance lead, carpentry and remodeling, James Duddy - lead HVAC (heating and air conditioning) and Karoon Chanthavong - HVAC.

Karoon came to campus one year ago with 7 years of HVAC experience. He works with James Duddy. When asked what he wanted his classified coworkers

to know, Karoon said, "It's unbelievable both of us keep the heating and air conditioning equipment going on the entire campus. The oldest equipment on campus is approximately 50 years old".

Rounding out the facilities and maintenance team is Stephanie Rodriguez. Described by her supervisor, Loren Holmquist, as "the glue that holds the whole Facilities and Operations Department together", Stephanie is the youngest employee and the only female in Facilities and Operations.

A few of the tasks Stephanie works on include the campus capital projects, monitors multiple budgets. She is the administrative assistant to the director and assists with personnel and customer service.

The reason I am highlighting the facilities department this month, is to demonstrate that contributing to the success of students takes many forms and as classified staff, we all have a role to play. If it was not for the efforts of this team, students would not be able to attend class, nor would they have grounds that provide a welcoming space, not just to attend our college, but to study and succeed in their education goals.

Thank you to this fantastic team of classified staff. You make a difference every day and your efforts are appreciated!


