	В	Equity Minded Syllabus We are working on putting together a small group to develop some samples and models of syllabi that will help with language and policy - making it more equity minded. The outcome will be samples brought to the Academic Senate for discussion and then, potentially, endorsed models provided on the Academic Senate website. This does not mean it is mandatory, and can models can be used as a guide, allowing for changing where it suits individual contexts. Several faculty are attending the upcoming equity institute and we will be reaching out to them to participate in this group. We also have two faculty who have recently completed a course which included sections on equity-minded syllabus development. One or both of them will be presenting to the Academic Senate.								
	C	Engineering There has been some interest in starting an engineering program. Originally it was a program that would be exclusive to Cuyamaca. When the notion was raised at the district level, there was some pushback from Cuyamaca. Grossmont was then tasked with showing the Chancellor how this program would be viable in a district where one program already existed. The chancellor has given Grossmont the go ahead for Grossmont to develop an Engineering program. Because program development is one of the items of the "10+1" and under the purview of the Academic Senate, we need to move this discussion/approval through a process. We discovered we do not have a well-developed process. This led to much research on how other Senates do this work. We are also collecting information on any past processes. The Senate Officers will present a process for discussion/vote this semester.
