ARTICULATION AGREEMENT 2016-2017**

This Articulation Agreement will be reviewed, amended, updated and/or expanded by mutual agreement through a biannual review by representatives of each institution.

Major preparation / general education requirements: Alliant International University will accept up to 60 lower division transferable units and all articulated coursework listed below in preparation for its undergraduate majors. Alliant International University will also accept CSU GE-Breadth Certification to satisfy Alliant's lower division general education requirements.

Admission requirements:

1. A completed application.
2. Official transcripts:
 - High School Students and/or students who have earned less than 24 college units: An official High School Transcript as well as official transcripts from all colleges attended that should be considered for the transfer credit evaluation
 - Students who have earned 24 or more college units: An official high school graduation date as well as official transcripts from all colleges attended that should be considered for the transfer credit evaluation
3. A nonrefundable application fee of \$65.
4. The minimum grade point average (GPA) requirement for undergraduate admission is a cumulative of 2.0 on a 4.0 scale.
