IGETC may not clear all general education requirements and is not recommended for all majors.

All courses must be completed with a "C" or better. "D" or "C-" grades are not acceptable for IGETC.

Courses can be certified in only one area.

Fulfillment of IGETC does not guarantee admission.

Courses may be taken with a "P" (Pass) but both the CSU and UC systems have a limit on the number of units.

Students must request official certification of IGETC in Admissions and Records/Evaluations.

Consult with a Counselor to determine how external exam scores (AP and IB) are applied to meet IGETC areas.
