## Transfer Summary

Students who complete an A.A./A.S. degree inclusive of all the requirements in the Intersegmental General Education Transfer Curriculum (IGETC) will be able to transfer from a community college to an Argosy University campus and satisfy 60 lower division credits. Transferring students will need to complete the B.A. or B.S. program and an additional Argosy Mathematics course, PSY 180 and ASP 100 as shown in the table below. Use either www.assist.org or a community college catalog for specific courses which satisfy IGETC requirements.

All areas of the IGETC should be certified prior to transfer. Students are responsible for requesting IGETC certification by completing the REQUEST FOR CERTIFICATION OF TRANSFER GENERAL EDUCATION REQUIREMENTS form from your community college Counselor.
