Note: Admission to SDSU School of Nursing is very competitive. Over the past four year transfer applicants had an average G.P.A. of 3.7; an average prerequisite G.P.A. of 3.7 and average TEAS score of 84.

Note: Students must complete SDSU's PSY 101 and 230 (PSY 120 and 150 @Grossmont) to satisfy Nursing Program graduation requirements. However, these courses are no longer prerequisites for admission to the Nursing Program.

Applications to the School of Nursing coincide with San Diego State University's application cycle. The application cycle for both SDSU and the School of Nursing is October 1st to November 30th. (Dates may vary. Applicants are responsible for checking the SDSU and School of Nursing websites for any changes.) For the School of Nursing, fall and spring terms, submit only the application between October 1st and November 30th. Additional required documents will be submitted, for both fall and spring completion, by January 31st. **Pre-requisites for the fall 2017 term must be complete by fall 2016.**

General Education Requirements – SDSU Catalog

Students will complete a minimum of 49 units of General Education to include a minimum of nine upper division units. No more than 12 units may be used for General Education credit from any one department or academic unit. When completed, request full or partial CSU GE Certification. Follow the Grossmont College "green sheet." Courses fulfilling A1, A2, A3 and B4 must be completed with a grade of C or higher for SDSU admission.

III. American Institutions: See the "green" sheet located in the Grossmont College Counseling Center. It is strongly advised that prior to transfer, students complete the two courses accepted by CSU that fulfill American Institutions.

IV. Explorations: (Upper division courses therefore not available at Grossmont College.) Nine units to include SDSU PHIL 330. Check the SDSU catalog and SDSU Nursing Department for additional information.

A minor is not required with this major. Academic credit through examination is also available. Students are required to be CPR certified prior to admission. Students are also required to meet the health requirement by having a medical examination and immunizations. Registered Nurses with an AS Degree in Nursing:

A Registered Nurse-Bachelor of Science nursing program is available for registered nurses with either an Associate Degree in nursing or a Diploma in nursing. Students eligible for this option should contact the SDSU School of Nursing office for special advising and program planning.

International Experience: Nursing majors (excluding second bachelor degree students) are required to participate in an international experience to increase awareness of cross-cultural issues, global health, economic, political, cultural, social services, and health challenges experienced by local populations in international environments.
