DEADLINE TO APPLY IS SEPTEMBER 10TH

- Be a first-time college student (California resident or AB540 eligible)
- Sign the Promise Pledge at: MyCollegePromise.net
- Submit a FAFSA or California Dream Act application
- Complete the college onboarding (Application, Orientation, Assessment, and Education Plan)
- Attend as a full-time student (At least 12 units per semester)
- Maintain a 2.0 college GPA (to remain eligible)
