<u>Transfer Admission Requirements</u> - The CSU system has established a requirement of 48 semester units in general education as part of a baccalaureate degree. At least 9 of the 48 GE units must be upper division courses. Students attending a community college may complete 39 of the 48 semester units prior to transfer. Upon request, Grossmont College students will receive full CSU general education by completing a minimum of 39 units from Areas A through E.
