## **IMPORTANT FACTS:**

Students must request Official certification by the Grossmont College Admissions- Evaluations Office. For additional information and clarification, review the IGETC Q & A which is available in the Counseling Center.

1. Obtain a new IGETC list each year, as there may be additions or deletions. The course must be on the list at the time you take the course.

- 2. IGETC does not guarantee admission.
- 3. Courses may be listed in more than one area, but can not be certified in more than one area.
- 4. "D or C- "grades are not acceptable for IGETC.
- 5. Courses may be taken for a "P (Pass)" grade, but the CSU/UC systems have a limit on the number of units that may be taken for "P." Check the transfer institution catalog.
- Advanced Placement (AP) scores of 3 or better can be used to clear courses. The Critical Thinking/Composition area (1B) cannot be cleared by an AP test score. One AP test clears one course. Meet with a Counselor to determine how your AP scores are applied to meet IGETC general education areas.
- 7. Foreign language is required for the UC system. See 6A.
- 8. There are limitations at UC's-high unit majors, professional schools, etc., that may restrict the use of IGETC. See list of UC limitations in the Counseling Office.
- 9. Summer school is part of the prior year. The UC system strongly recommends completion of IGETC certification by <u>Spring semester</u> if transferring for a Fall semester/quarter.
- 10. Students must request official college transcripts from other colleges and from high school if the foreign language needs to be verified. Have them sent to the Grossmont College Admissions Office as soon as possible.
- 11. Make an appointment with a Counselor to discuss the IGETC pattern. Visit the Grossmont College Transfer Center.
