Any major is acceptable



Chem major not required for pharmacy



Pharmacy schools require some extra lower & upper division Biology courses.



Some majors have higher acceptance rates because fewer of those majors apply (Philosophy, Anthropology, History, Literature)



Double major not necessary



Major in what you are strong in and enjoy

in biology, chemistry,
 or other science



GPA's: med school mean = 3.7+; pharmacy mean = 3.4-3.6

- English 120 and 124
- Chem 120, 141,142, 231,232
- Bio 230, 240
- Physics 130, 131 or 140,240,241 (dep. on major)
- Math 180, 280, 160
- More math for certain majors (chem, physics, math, engin.)
- Psych 120, Soc 120 (content on the MCAT)
- Cross-cultural Studies 114, 115, 125 or 144
- (Cross Cultural Awareness on the MCAT)
- Upper div. Biochemistry (after you transfer)





Biological Sciences (biology, org chem, biochemistry)



Physical Sciences (gen chem, gen physics, biochemistry)

You can repeat the MCAT; Med Schools don't average scores



MCAT Prep courses: Kaplan, Princeton Review (\$3,000; some scholarships)



You can take MCAT 3 times; 4th attempt needs letter from counselor



Take MCAT <u>before</u> you apply to medical schools

HOW LONG IS MEDICAL SCHOOL?

Four years total

lst two years: the
"healthy body",
science and labs, intro
to clinical interviewing,
case studies

 Anatomy, genetics, biochemistry, hematology, immunology, endocrinology, reprod systems, neuro, cardio, etc.

2nd two years: the "sick body", hospital dept. rotations

- Peds, ER, Internal, OB/GYN, Gen. Surgery, Psychiatry
- Ophthalmology, Neurology, Cardiology, Orthopedics, etc.
- "USMLE" after 1st two years; after 2nd two years
- -- United States Medical License Examination--

MEDICAL RESIDENCIES

- 3 to 7 years long, after med school, in hospitals
- Paid \$55-65,000/year (1st year residents)
- Loans deferred while in residency
- USMLE exam (after 1st year residency)
- Specialty board exam after residency
- Hospital privileges require board certification
- Fellowships sub-specialty training, 2+ years (paid)
- CME units periodically to renew medical license
- Military & Public Health scholarships:
 - Free tuition, officer salary (O-2), O-4
 after graduate

WHEN TO APPLY ??

- 1. Take and retake MCAT or PCAT before applying.
- Apply to med or pharm <u>application service</u> in June
 *send transcripts, scores, school list, essay, \$\$\$
- Apply to <u>individual med and pharm schools</u> in summer
 *send letters, more questions to answer, photo, \$\$
- Interviews start in Sept and run through April at the school
- 5. School starts in early to mid August

<u>If rejected</u>: post-bac program, retake exam, get more experience, get better letters, or all of the above, or

move to another state and apply from there, or

Do something very different for two years then reapply:

*Peace Corps, City Year, Volunteer abroad, Master's, etc.

CRITICAL THINGS TO REMEMBER:

Take a "W" instead of D or F in a course.

Med and Pharm schools average all grades

Use P/NP wisely, but not for required courses

Finish all major pre-reqs here before transfer

Med and Pharm schools look at a few GPA's:

• Overall gpa, science gpa, non-sci gpa, pre-req gpa

Establish relationships w/ professors and professionals:

• 3-5 letters of recommendation needed to apply
